Regarding: Food allergens in cell culture products


Many foods have been identified as having the potential to cause food allergies in sensitive individuals.

The US Food Allergen Labeling and Consumer Protection Act of 2004 states that eight major foods or food groups—milk, eggs, fish, Crustacean shellfish, tree nuts, peanuts, wheat, and soybeans—account for 90 percent of food allergies.

Regulation (EU) No 1169/2011 on the provision of food information to consumers details the requirements surrounding allergen and nutritional labeling of food. Substances or products causing allergies or intolerances are listed in Annex II of this Regulation.

It is hereby stated that Cytiva's cell culture products are not intended to be used as food, as ingredients in food, or as direct components/constituents of ingredients used in food. Therefore, these products do not fall under US, EU or international food allergen regulations.

Neither incoming raw materials nor finished products themselves are tested for the presence of allergens.
